


# Summer Fiesta thanks and well done!

# Governor News: Positive Workplace Survey by Harriet Becher - vice chair of governors

Staff wellbeing is very important to us at Ashmead. The school recently joined an employee assistance scheme, which will offer emotional and practical support to staff who need it. Staff will take part in an annual wellbeing survey, which will help us find out how well we are doing on staff wellbeing and highlight areas for improvement. Governors recently reviewed the results of the first staff survey. We were really pleased to see that staff wellbeing at Ashmead is generally very high. Ashmead's results put us in the top 10% nationally of all schools participating in the scheme. Staff were much more likely than average to agree with statements like: 'I believe in our organisation'; 'I enjoy my job immensely'; 'we are always searching for new ways to be better'; 'it is rare for me to feel that my job is dull and boring'; 'we are achieving things we can be proud of'; 'I have the opportunity to use my skills and initiative in my work'; 'there is a real interest in the welfare and wellbeing of the people who work here'; and 'the people my colleagues and I deal with treat us with decency and respect'. These are really fantastic results and reflect Ashmead's vision and values very strongly. The survey has also given us some issues to consider. Our results on teacher workload and long hours are in line with national averages, but there is more we could do to improve and balance workloads, especially for teachers earlier in their careers who are most likely to feel overloaded. We also want to create closer links between different staff groups and teams, and improve communication with part time staff and support staff. We will run the survey again in a year and hope to see an improvement in these

We are very lucky to have such a committed, positive and loyal group of staff at Ashmead - we are determined to look after them.
