Governor news: Loveable Child work with staff by Carolyn Mumby

At the beginning of term I was really pleased to attend a staff meeting to share with the staff team how research has shown that children's self esteem, well-being and resilience supports them now and later in life, and can impact directly on their achievement and capability.



You will know that our vision at Ashmead is that children leave us feeling both Loveable and Capable. You may remember from previous newsletters that we have developed three colourful wheel diagrams, each with 6 sections supported by some solution focused coaching questions, which focus on what we mean by the 'loveable' part of this vision. The tools are designed to help the children reflect on what they have in place to support them at Ashmead and also provide a way to invite the children to think about how they could build on where they are now and develop further in these and other respects.

Staff gave some very positive feedback about how useful the materials are, and also some ideas about how we can improve them, and what we need to think about more to ensure that we can be clearer and more effective when using them with the children.

I really enjoyed working with the staff team who were very thoughtful and insightful about the children's needs and their wellbeing. We will be continuing to work with them as they pilot these materials over the next year.
