Caliph 'Abbas - First Abbasid Caliph - moved Abbasid capital from Kufa to Baghdad



Al-Khawarizmi. mathematician, astronomer. scientist, provided the

foundations of algebra and other concepts



Daroun al-Rashid -Caliph from 786-809, defeated Byzantines in battle (806), made links with

European Empires such as Charlemagne in France.
