


Safeguarding

Safeguard - to protect from harm or damage with an appropriate measure

As the weather slowly starts to warm up again we'd like to remind everyone about appropriate summer clothes and footwear that will enable your children to enjoy the sun and outdoor play whilst also staying safe.

Shoulders, backs and upper arms should be covered - children's skin is particularly vulnerable to burning so no vests, spaghetti straps or strapless or sleeveless tops please.





Children also must have a named water bottle to school every day so they can keep hydrated throughout the day. Please do not put water bottles in book bags as they often leak over books and ruin them! Thanks for your cooperation!

Lower School News (Nursery, Reception, Year 1 and Year 2)

As we move towards the final half term of the year it is wonderful to see such confident and independent children in EYFS and KS1. Reception have been busy applying the skills they have learned during phonics in their independent play, such as writing stories, recipes and signs. Nursery have also started a big interest in their writing journey, making books and writing wonderful stories together.

There has also been a continued interest in mini-beasts in year 1 with the children observing all the small creatures who visit our gardens and creating a Bug Hotel that caters for all their different needs. Y1 have also begun counting in 2s, 5s and 10s and are continuing this in their play with scoring games and counting to a Macarena dance - ask your children about it! There are some great counting videos on scratchgarden.com In literacy, Y1 have been continuing their animal books, adding in a page all about reptiles, and finishing the book with a scales and fur collage.

Y2 have been reading 'The Bear under the Stairs' in literacy and thinking about different sentence types: questions,

statements and commands to include when writing a postcard to a character in the story. In maths Y2 have been measuring mass on mechanical and digital scales and measuring objects in grams and kgs -you could continue this learning at home when baking or cooking – reading the digital or analogue scales.

All year groups have been practising for Sports Day in their PE slot - under arm throws towards a target, running for speed using our arms (and a 'pocket to mouth' motion) and jumping in a hessian sack ready for the sack race!
