School Dinners and Packed Lunches

As many parents know children from Reception to Year 6 are now entitled to a free meal at lunchtime. What parents might not know is that the funding offered for this doesn't yet match the cost of the meals so this is something we are working on in terms of budgeting and future planning. As Chartwells (our school meals provider) charge us for the number of meals made/served each day it is important that those numbers are as accurate as possible to avoid the school being overcharged and incurring more expenditure.

Therefore to tighten this system, after February half term we will be asking parents to choose **either** school dinners **or** packed lunch for the whole half term. Whatever choice is made cannot be changed day-to-day or week to week as neither the school nor Chartwells has the admin capacity for this. Allowing this to happen has resulted in us being overcharged for meals so unfortunately it is necessary to refine our systems. If parents want to change from school dinner to packed lunch or vice versa this can only be done on a half termly basis.

Inclusion Matters

Last week, teachers had training from our speech and language therapist on how to recognise children who may have difficulties with their receptive language. Receptive language difficulties occur when a person has trouble understanding the words that they hear and read, which then impacts on learning. We support children at Ashmead with these difficulties by:

- making efforts to speak a little slower than usual when speaking to the child
- using short simple instructions instead of lengthy complex ones
- explaining things in different ways to help with understanding
- using pictures and concrete learning materials to represent abstract things

If you have concerns that your child may have difficulties in this area, please speak to your child's class teacher or myself and we can arrange some time to discuss them.
